What Is A Core Course?

A core course must:

1. A core course must be an academic course that receives high school graduation credit in the following:
 - One or a combination of these areas: English, Mathematics, Natural/Physical Science, Social Science, Foreign Language, Comparative Religion or Philosophy
2. Four-year college preparatory
3. At or above your high school's regular academic level
4. Algebra I or higher in the mathematics area
5. Taught by a qualified instructor

Mount Vernon High School NCAA Approved Core Courses:

Courses designated with a '=' symbol are courses that may be used only by students with a diagnosed disability. A course for a student with disabilities must be exclusively open to students with documented learning disabilities. The course must be quantitatively and qualitatively the same as the regular equivalent and there must be a standardized curriculum/syllabus.
